| Remarks          | <p>1. Other provisions concerning compulsory and general education courses can be found in the regulations of “The Yuan-Ze University Common Compulsory Course Program.”</p> <p>2. The maximum credits for general education courses is 10, the exceeding credits will not be counted. International Language Center elective course can not be recognized</p> <p>3. The graduation credit requirement is 128; this must comprise 33 credits of common compulsory courses, 32 credits of department-mandated courses, and 63 credits of elective courses (this department requires a minimum of 39 credits).</p> <p>4. Type-II fieldwork and internships are considered terminal curriculum courses</p> <p>5. Students will select at least two of the four areas: "community planning", "social work", "government administration" and "cultural governance", as a compulsory course module. Each module will complete at least three courses.</p> <p>(1) The "Community Planning" module will include "Social Issues in Taiwan", "Community Organization and Development", "Nonprofit Organization and Management", "Social Care and Practice", "Social Enterprise and Social Innovation".</p> <p>(2) The "Social Work" module will include: "Human Behavior and Social Environment", "Introduction to Social Work", "Introduction to Social Welfare", "Social Policy and Social Legislation", "Program Design and Evaluation".</p> <p>(3) The "Government Administration" modules will include "political science", "administrative law", "human resources management", "political economy" and "social policy analysis".</p> <p>(4) "Cultural Governance" modules will include "Introduction to Cultural Studies", "Ethnic Relations and Multiculturalism", "Taiwan Social and Cultural Studies", "Introduction to Cultural Industries" and "Cultural Policy".</p> |   |   |   |   |   |   |   |
